Partnerships to Uplift Communities (PUC) founded PUC Lakeview Charter High School (PUC LCHS) in 2010 to serve the students living in the *Northeast San Fernando Valley, with a concentration on the communities of San Fernando and Sylmar*. In the seventh year of operation, PUC LCHS' Class of 2018 will be the fifth graduating class. The mission of PUC Schools is to develop and manage high quality charter schools in densely populated urban communities with overcrowded and low achieving schools. We create school programs and cultures that result in preparing all students for career readiness and college completion. We uplift and revitalize communities through the development of educational and other supportive partnerships. PUC LCHS has developed a successful partnership with Los Angeles Mission College. This *partnership* allows students to take college classes while in high school in 9th-12th grade. PUC Schools use an educational model based on high expectations for all students, highly qualified teachers and principals, and parents as partners. The school operates on a traditional August-June academic calendar. PUC LCHS is proud to be recognized as a California Distinguished School.

Grading:

In alignment with University of California and California State University undergraduate admissions requirements, PUC Schools do not grant "D" letter grades. A grade below a "C" is a fail and will not satisfy the PUC graduation requirements. Students earning an "F" for any required course must repeat the course to earn a grade of "C" or higher.

Rank - PUC Schools does not rank students.

Grade Replacement - Starting the 2016-2017 school year, PUC Schools are implementing a PUC-Wide grade replacement policy. Students may retake any failed course, and the newly earned GPA and credits will replace the previously failed course GPA and credits (Must be same course name & content). The original failed course will remain on a student's transcript.

- English.....40 Credits
- Math.....30 Credits
- History/Social Science.....30 Credits
- Foreign Language.....20 Credits
- Laboratory Science.....20 Credits
- Visual & Perf. Arts.....10 Credits
- College Prep Electives.....10 Credits
- Physical Education.....20 Credits

Minimum of 220 Credits is required for high school graduation
