

School Information

PUC Triumph Charter High School (PUC TCHS) was founded by PUC in 2010 to serve the students living in the *Northeast San Fernando Valley, with a concentration on the communities of Sylmar, San Fernando, Pacoima, and Sun Valley.* In our seventh year of operation, PUC TCHS' Class of 2018 will be our fifth graduating class. The mission of PUC Schools is to develop and manage high quality charter schools in densely populated urban communities with overcrowded and low achieving schools. We create school programs and cultures that result in college graduation for all students. We uplift and revitalize communities through the development of educational and other supportive partnerships. This year PUC TCHS has continued its successful partnership with Los Angeles Mission College allowing students in grades 9th through 12th to take college classes. PUC Schools use an educational model based on high expectations for all students, highly qualified teachers and principals, and parents as partners. The school operates on a traditional August-June academic calendar. In April 2017, PUC TCHS was honored with a Gold Ribbon Award by the California Department of Education.

Grading:

In alignment with University of California and California State University undergraduate admissions requirements, PUC Schools do not grant "D" letter grades. A grade below a "C" is a fail and will not satisfy the PUC graduation requirements. Students earning an "F" for any required course must repeat the course to earn a grade of "C" or higher.

Rank - PUC Schools does not rank students.

Grade Replacement - Starting the 2015-2016 school year, PUC Schools are implementing a PUC-Wide grade replacement policy. Students may retake any failed course, and the newly earned GPA and credits will replace the previously failed course GPA and credits (Must be same course name & content). The original failed course will remain on a student's transcript.
